Service is provided Monday through Friday during regular business hours.

New York State has various laws concerning dogs which are enforced across the state and in the Town of DeWitt. In addition the Town is responsible for: licensing dogs, picking up stray dogs, investigating “dangerous dogs”.

The Village of East Syracuse Dog Control Laws

The Village of East Syracuse has various local laws and regulations concerning control of dogs. Complaints should be made to the Town of DeWitt Dog Control Officer, the Village’s Code Enforcement Officer or the East Syracuse Police Department.

Leash law – all dogs are required to be on a leash, and accompanied by its owner or a responsible person able to control the dog.

Pooper Scooper law – owners are responsible for preventing their dogs from defecating on the property of others, and are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs.

Barking dogs – local dog control laws prohibit owners from allowing or keeping any dog on their premises, which continually makes loud or long-continued noises to the disturbance or annoyance of others.
