VILLAGE RESIDENT'S COMMENTS & CONCERNS:

Resident's Questions:

- Q. What level of input does the mayor and the village board have with the town of Dewitt on the assessments?
- A. The Mayor and the Village Board have absolutely no power.
- Robert Germain includes that the board is prohibited to get involved with individual tax grievances however, the residents do have the right to do that for themselves.
 There is also the option of taking this matter to the town board and encourage a town wide reevaluation.
- Q. Is there an update on the ARPA Funds?
- A. We are currently working with Grant Rite on how we will be spending these funds. We have a couple infrastructure projects that require immediate attention due to flooding in certain areas.
- Q. Has the village raised the tax rate?
- A. The only thing that was changed is the units used when determining the sewer rates.
- Revitalization Committee will start to review applications once again as soon as a meeting date has been determined.
- Property owner and resident would like ask the village if they will reconsider putting together a tree ordinance to encourage property owners to take down unsafe trees that pose as a safety risk.
